ADMINISTRATIVE STAFFING

Administrative staffing changes for both the Youth and Continuing Education Sector were approved by Council on Monday, April 30, 2018. We are proud and confident in the teams that we have working with your children in our schools and we welcome the new additions to that team effective July 1st. JERSEY DAY

On April 12, 2018, a Canada wide support of the tragedy involving the Humbolt Broncos Hockey Team took place. Many schools and centers in the Lester B. Pearson School Board showed their support by wearing their favorite jersey/team t-shirt.

BISSONNETTE BUS STRIKE

The on-again/off-again strike by drivers for Autobus Bissonnette came to fruition on Monday, April 23rd. This affected students attending Birchwood, Evergreen, Macdonald High, Mount Pleasant, PETES and Westwood Junior and Senior. In total approximately 1000 students were affected. The two sides came to a contract agreement in the early evening of April 25th and service was resumed on regular schedules the next morning. On behalf of the school teams at each of the affected schools, we would like to thank parents for their understanding, support and cooperation over the course of the service disruption.

INTERCULTURAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Intercultural Advisory Committee held an open meeting on Wednesday, May 2nd on the topic of *Building Social Awareness Around Hatred and Race* with Dr. Andrea Sterzuk from the University of Regina's Faculty of Education.

ULTIMATE BATTLE OF THE BOOKS

The Ultimate Battle took place on April 17, 2018. Macdonald High School represented LBPSB and competed against Trafalgar School for Girls from the Quebec Association of Independent Schools and Lauren Hill Academy from the EMSB. VISIT FROM L'ACADEMIE DE L'ILE (FRANCE)

A delegation of administrators from L'Île, France arrived spent the week of April 23rd touring LBPSB schools and meeting with representatives from the Educational Services Department. This visit grew, in part, out of our involvement in DELF language certification across the board. The L'Île team is interested in bringing immersion programs to their network and wanted to visit our schools offering immersion programs. Feedback was very positive and lines of communication will remain open.

VISIT FROM SPANISH DELEGATION

A second group of delegates, this one from Spain, visited both Forest Hill Sr. and Children's World Academy on April 23rd. This delegation is looking to diversify the learning experiences of their students and is looking at some the innovations happening at LBPSB for inspiration.

QUI LIRA VAINCRA

Qui Lira Vaincra is a competition which promotes reading in French. It was held on April 25, 2018 and it involved elementary schools representing each of the three Regions of the School Board. Birchwood, St. Charles and Dorval Elementary participated. St. Charles was the winner of this competition!!!

ENRICHMENT EXAM

All registered in board grade 5 students will write on the professional day of Friday, May 11th. The exam format is the same as the standardized test which has been administered to Grade 6 students in previous years. Students from outside the system will write on Saturday, May 12th either at Macdonald High or JRHS. Our registration numbers are slightly higher than average from our November dates.

BIRCHWOOD ELEMENTARY GREEN TEAM

Students of Birchwood Elementary Green Team are busy composting, recycling, gardening as well as doing a massive clean-up of the landscape in front of the school. The Green Team began on the first day the school opened its doors in 2010. This project has blossomed thanks to dedicated teachers and committed students.

KINGSDALE KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS

The Kingsdale Kindergarteners spent a morning at Vivalis entertaining the seniors and basking in their wisdom and guidance. In some cases, secondary schools will need to convert planned "modified days" to full instructional days to compensate.
